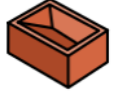

Old toys



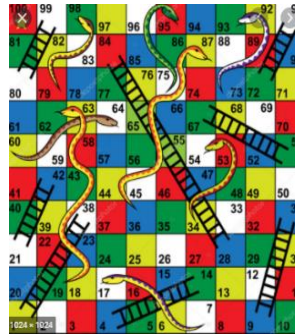
Plastic

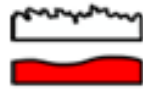

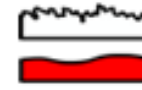
