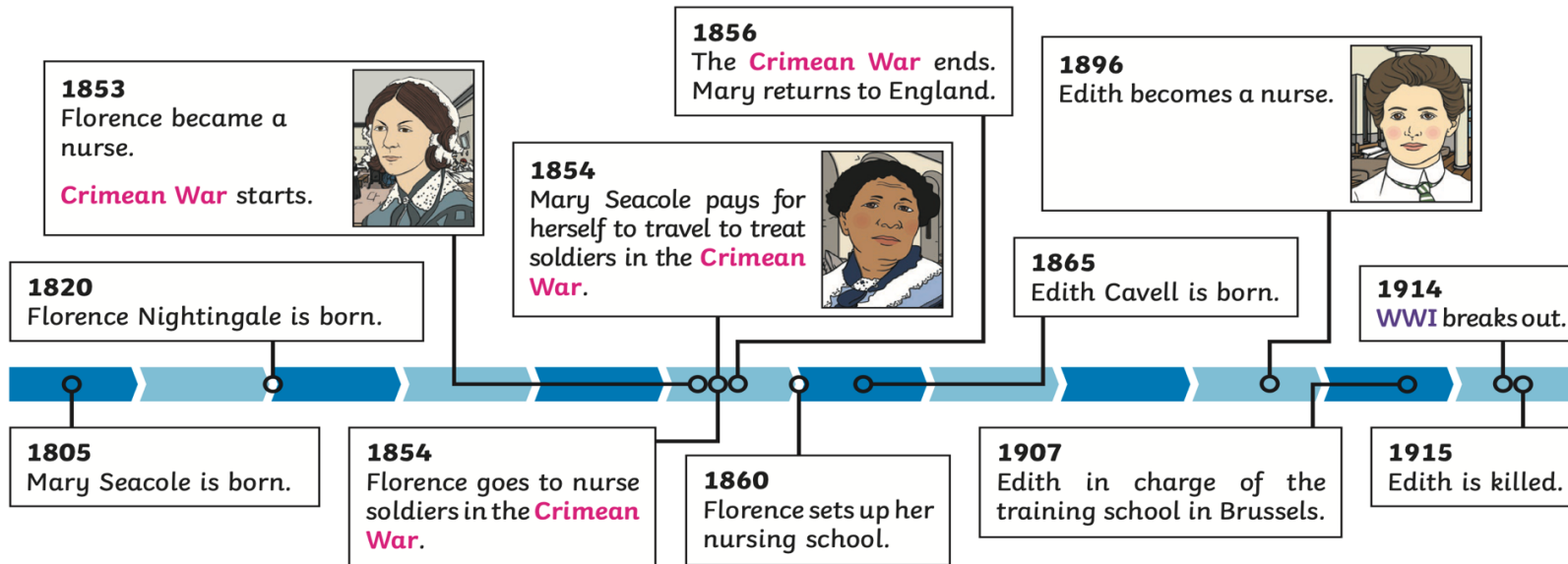

Florence Nightingale



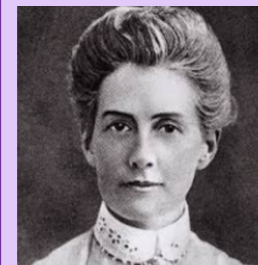

Mary Seacole



Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica in 1805. She wanted to treat the soldiers in the Crimean War but wasn't allowed. She decided to go anyway and set up her own British hospital. She treated soldiers from both sides of the war.

Edith Cavell



Edith Cavell was born in England on the 4th December 1865. She trained to be a nurse in 1896. She was arrested for saving soldiers from both sides of World War One.

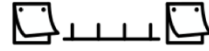
